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Language Analysis

Where does he/she work? – Please remember that while asking a questions in the present simple tense, and using *does*, the verb cannot have *s/es/ies* at the end.

She works in a hospital. For statements in the present simple tense, for 3rd person singular (*he, she it*), the verbs need to finish with *s/es/ies*.

There are some spelling rules that need to be followed, please see some examples:

work – *works* – most verbs get s only an s at the end

try – *tries* – if a verb finishes with y and y is preceded by a consonant it gets changed into ies

play – *plays* if a verb finishes with y and y is preceded by a vowel (*a, e, i, o, u*) it gets s only

watch – *watches* – if a verb finishes with *s, ss, sh, ch, x, o*, we add *es*

city / **'sɪti**/

farm / **fɑ:(r)m**/

field / **fi:ld**/ - area of land used for growing food

hospital - / **'hɒspɪt(ə)**/ - please pay attention, in many languages *h* is silent, it is not silent here

school / **sku:l**/

ship / **ʃɪp**/

Procedure

Warm-up Off the screens

1. Revise family members and jobs, this is best done orally initially, by asking Ss to talk about their family members and their jobs. This will give you the chance to check pronunciation and help with further vocabulary. Then give out Handout 1.

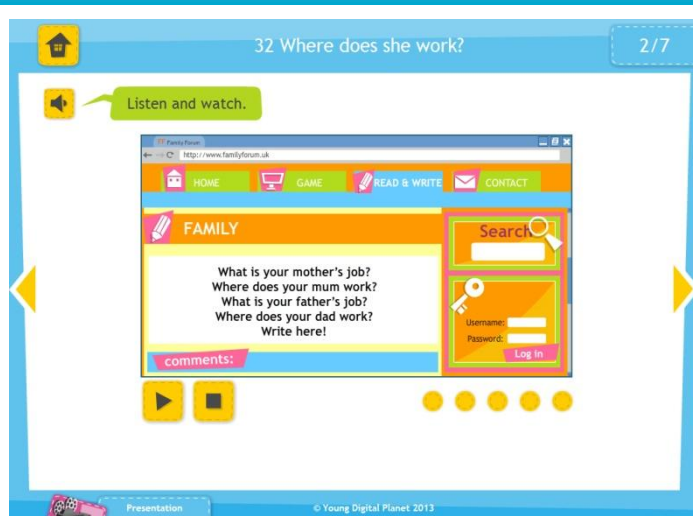

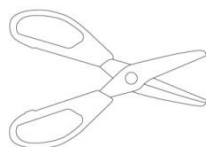

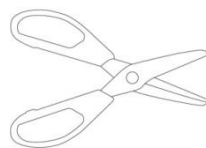
